

## READ ME

This document provides information needed to replicate all of the results in Cantoni et al., “Curriculum and Ideology”.

The files needed for replication are as follows:

## Overview:

Five datasets are used in the empirical analysis: main wave survey at Peking University (~survey.dta); follow-up wave survey (~followupsurvey.dta); word count of high school textbooks (~wordcount.dta); curriculum rollout dates and corresponding provincial characteristics (~rollout.dta); and data from Asian Barometer conducted in China (~asianbarometer.dta). We use a separate, second version of the main survey data to calculate summary statistics in Table 2 (~sumstats.dta) to preserve anonymity of the individuals.

We use a single .do file (curriculum\_ideology\_jpe\_replication.do) to be executed in Stata, which will call up each dataset as needed and produce the results reported in the paper as well as online Appendix.

Note that some figures and the summary statistics table are not automatically produced. The .do file clearly indicates the regressions used to generate each figure and table.

For data confidentiality reasons, the following limitations apply:

- Table 2: One observation has been dropped for computing the summary statistics
- Table 4: Panel B cannot be reproduced
- Table G.8: The table cannot be reproduced
- Table G.13: Panels A and C cannot be reproduced
- Figure F.2: Panels A and D can only partly be reproduced
